Putting First Nation Children First

Jordan's Principle Child First Initiative was developed to enhance and promote the well-being of our children, families, and communities in ways that will encourage growth in areas of health, education, culture, and social programs.

Jordan's Principle Service Coordinators work with community-based workers and families, to ensure that First Nation Children receive the care and access to programs and services in which they require and are entitled. "It is the belief that healthy and strong children are the foundation of healthy strong communities".

Jordan's Principle is intended to prevent First Nation children from being denied or experience delays in essential services due to jurisdictional disputes between governments or government departments regarding who should pay or where they live (On or Off-Reserve).

Jordan's Principle applies to all First Nations Children with an identified need for a publicly funded education, health or social service
